

As I stood before the enthusiastic crowd at the opening of the new Dorcas Creation Women's Empowerment Centre in Nairobi last month, I felt both honoured and inspired.



I felt honoured as CEO of Bright Futures to represent all those have generously given and worked so hard to help make this new centre a reality. And I felt inspired by the vision and commitment of our partners at Dorcas Creation, and especially by their founder and leader Jane Thuo, who stepped out in faith in 2006 to establish an organisation to help lift women living in impoverished conditions in the informal settlements (slums) of Nairobi, Kenya. Here's something of what I shared with those present at the celebration.

'The connection between Bright Futures and Dorcas Creations goes back to 2011 when Jane Thuo came to Australia at the initiation of her good friend Jyoti. While in Australia Jane met Barbara and Paul Madden, founders of Bright Futures, and shared with them the work she was doing to help uplift women in the informal settlements of Nairobi. The seeds for a partnership between Dorcas Creation and Bright Futures were planted and in 2012 support for the project began. The Women's Empowerment Centre will provide a permanent and secure home for Dorcas Creations. It allows Dorcas Creations to live out our Lord's command to 'Love your neighbour' - to provide healing and hope to the thousands of women and their families who will pass through these gates.'

As I reflect on the event and the coming together of Bright Futures and Dorcas Creation I am inspired by what can be achieved when in a spirit of love and concern for others we work together as partners and friends. I am so deeply grateful for all who have helped make this new centre possible.

SOUTH SUDANESE REFUGEE STUDENTS **ON A PATH TO A BRIGHTER FUTURE**

The students have now completed primary school and are spread across the four levels of secondary school. It has been tough going for the students whose families have little more than the clothes on their back. Yet the students are persevering, knowing that education is the path to a better life for them and their families.



PAKISTAN: EMERGENCY HELP FOR RIOT VICTIMS

On 16 August in Jaranwala city rioting mobs in Jaranwala city destroyed 25 churches and many homes. People ran for lives. Many were left homeless and without food. Our partner group in Pakistan, Global Gospel Mission Lahore received many desperate calls for help. Project leader, Cecil Barkat reported that Bright Futures support enabled he and his team to provide emergency food supplies for many families as they face this terrible situation.

Congratulations to the Youth Governor's Leadership Foundation team (pictured above with SA Governor, the Hon Frances Adamson AC) in supporting Bright Futures through a project aimed at raising awareness and funds for Malaria rapid testing kits for use in communities in Northern Uganda. The team did a tremendous job in raising \$2,495 and the presentation at their graduation was superb! Prompt diagnosis in patients suspected to have Malaria has the potential to greatly improve treatment, especially in remote areas. The kits help save lives by enabling early treatment, especially for those at highest risk.
